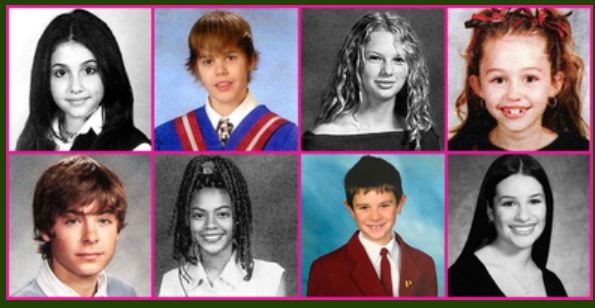

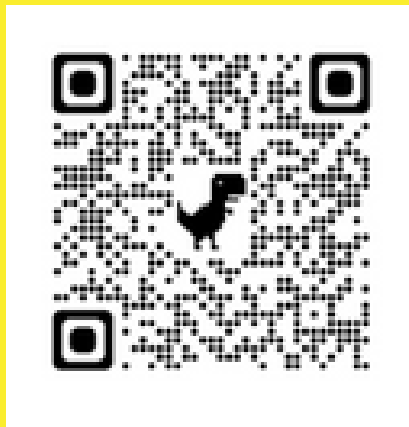

Founded as 'National Access Awareness Week' in 1988 and inspired by Rick Hansen's Man in Motion World Tour, this week is an opportunity to celebrate Canadians with disabilities and raise awareness of the critical need for accessibility and inclusion in every community and workplace.



The National Day of Remembrance for Victims of Terrorism is a time to remember those who have lost their lives through acts of terror. The date was chosen to coincide with the anniversary of the tragic bombing of Air India Flight 182 off the coast of Ireland in 1985.



World Refugee Day aims to honour the courage of millions of refugees worldwide and the many contributions they make in their new country.

peoples. National Aboriginal Day, as it was named at the time, was first celebrated on June 21, 1996, after being recognized through a proclamation by then Governor General Roméo LeBlanc. On June 21, 2017, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau issued a statement announcing the government's intention to rename National Aboriginal Day to National Indigenous Peoples Day." Join us at City Park in Kingston on June 21st to celebrate National Indigenous Peoples Day!

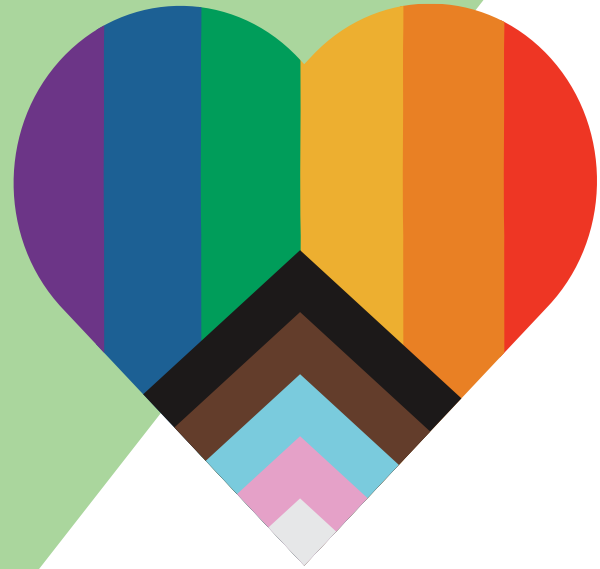
